Home Maintenance

Letters to a Friend / Housing

Objectives	By the end of this lesson, participants will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Recognize the importance of housing upkeep and develop a positive attitude toward cleaning.• Describe how to maintain a clean and safe home environment.
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Time	20 – 30 minutes
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Materials	Housing Letters to a Friend (included) in appropriate language ¹
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Procedure

- Divide the class into four groups and distribute a copy of the letters to each group.
- After they've had a chance to read the letters, ask participants if they would want to be in the same situation described in the letter. Why or why not?
- Ask them to list the housing problems described in the letter as a large group.
- Go through each problem, asking participants to describe how they would go about solving each one. Encourage participants to reference the Mercy Housing excerpt.

Variation

This lesson could be facilitated with the entire class as one large group. Where available, refer to mock kitchen and bathroom facilities when discussing those appliances or fixtures.

Assessment

Ask summarizing questions to reinforce teaching points.

1 March 10

Dear Day Paw,

I'm writing to let you know about my apartment, it looks very nice and it suits my family well. The apartment is quite different from our house in the camp. It is like a big room with small rooms inside it. My apartment is on the fourth floor, but we don't have to walk up and down the stairs because we have elevator in our apartment so when Baw Poe buys a big bag of rice, he does not need to carry the big bag up the stairs. We have two bedrooms in our apartment, one for me and Baw Poe and another one for our two sons. The apartment owner put carpet in both our bedrooms and living room so the floor is very soft to walk and we don't have to be afraid that the floor will squeak when we walk at night.

The kitchen and bathroom is also inside our apartment, not attached to our house like in the camp. In the kitchen, I don't have to use charcoal anymore as they have the electrical stove and oven. Our RA staff taught us how to use the stove and oven, but I only use the stove. We also can't cause too much smoke when cooking because there is a smoke detector on the ceiling of our apartment. If there is too much smoke in our apartment, the smoke detector will be activated and it sprinkles water all over the room.

Before the RA staff left, she also told me that there is a washing facility in the apartment building and we have to check our mailbox for letters and bills. Oh, a lot to learn about our new house in America. I have attached you the picture of our new house here.

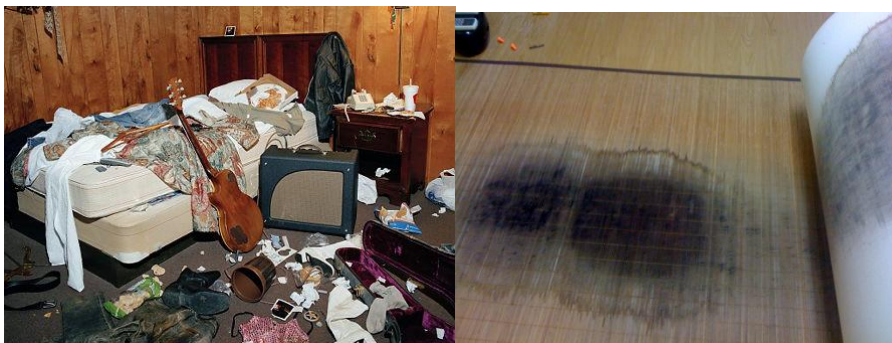

Dear Day Paw,

I have bad news. The apartment owner told us today that he would terminate our lease and we will have to find a new place to live at the end of this month.
